- A curious mindset and a passion to learn about other people's perspectives
- A basic understanding of local and Wyoming politics
- Strong verbal and written communications skills
- The ability to learn and use new digital software
- A long-term dedication to improving our state and the lives of us who live here

The schedule for this position is generally flexible but does involve attending regular staff meetings via Zoom as well as occasional events.
