

The following outlines key findings from a survey of likely 2026 Wyoming voters focused on K-12 public schools and policies that would impact the public education system. Interviews were conducted statewide May 19-21, 2025. The margin of error for the full sample (n = 500) is +/- 4.4% and the margin of error among sub-groups is greater. Respondents' political identification breaks down as 414 Republicans, 25 unaffiliated, 54 Democrats and 7 "no response."

Wyoming voters overwhelmingly do not support criminally charging educators and librarians with obscenity charges.

- A majority of voters (61%) oppose charging educators and librarians with obscenity charges over library and classroom materials
- 45% of voters "strongly oppose" charging educators and librarians with obscenity charges over library and classroom materials

Wyoming voters largely oppose allowing certain books and other materials to be banned from being taught in a public school or from being available in a public library

- 54% of voters oppose banning books in our schools and libraries
- 42% of respondents strongly oppose banning books
- Only 17% of respondents strongly support banning certain books in classrooms and libraries

Wyoming residents strongly support public education and believe their local schools receive a "passing grade" (76%).

Wyoming voters largely disapprove of the way the state legislature is handling public education.

- 49% disapprove of the legislature's handling of public education
- Of that figure, 23% strongly disapprove
- Only 4% strongly approve of the legislature's approach to public education
