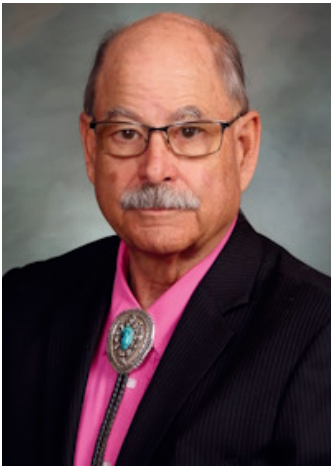

**CO-SPONSORED a constitutional amendment that would harm public education** by blocking courts from reviewing whether the Legislature is properly funding schools. (SJ-08 - failed)

# TAX REFORM

**Voted FOR a constitutional amendment that would harm Wyoming communities** by completely eliminating property tax revenue while increasing sales tax. ([SJ-03](#) - failed)

**Voted AGAINST a bill that would make housing more expensive** by prohibiting “mitigation fees” that help pay for workforce housing. ([HB-141](#)- failed)

**Voted FOR a bill that would harm Wyoming communities** by eliminating property tax mill levies that fund schools and draining the state’s savings in order to cover the loss. ([SF-110](#) - failed)

# OTHER

**Voted AGAINST a budget amendment that would fully fund the University of Wyoming**, provide state employees cost-of-living raises, restore funding to the Dept. of Health, and fund other critical public services. ([SF-01-2001](#) - passed)

**Voted FOR a bill that would make voting harder for seniors** by eliminating Medicare cards as a valid form of voter ID. ([SF-29](#) - failed)

**Voted FOR a bill that would harm business and economic development** by terminating the Wyoming Business Council. ([SF-065](#) - failed)

**Voted AGAINST a resolution that would protect public land** by rejecting any large-scale sale of federal land within Wyoming. ([SJ-09](#) - passed)

**Voted AGAINST a bill that would increase people’s ability to buy homes** by creating a fund specifically for workforce housing programs. ([SF-64](#) - failed)

**Voted FOR a bill that would harm workers** by not allowing them to pay union dues from their own paychecks via direct deposit. ([HB-178](#) - passed)

**Voted AGAINST a bill that would increase access to public land** by clarifying it is legal to cross at the corners where two parcels of public land meet. ([HB-19](#) - failed)
